**Writing linked to Topic Read**

Yesterday you read about an artist called David Hockney. Tomorrow you will be learning a bit more about his iPad art and you'll be having a go at creating your own.

Today, we would like you to look at the **'View from a Window'** PPT on the website. It shows a collection of the art Hockney produced on his iPad while looking out of a window.

Pick a window in your home and take a step back. What do you see when you look out of the window? What time of day is it? What colours can you see? What buildings/trees/flowers/etc. are framed by your window?



For writing today, write a description of what you see. Call it **'The View From My Window'**.

Because it is a **descriptive setting**, we will expect to see:

- \*Figurative language (metaphor, personification, simile)
- \*Vivid language (thesaurus)
- \*Author techniques (repetition, lists, alliteration)

We will also expect your writing to be grammatically accurate with:

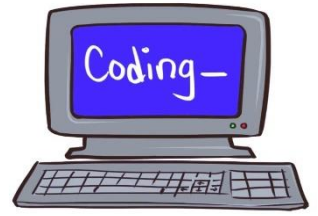
- \*a range of sentence structures
- \*a range of sentence openers (SPACE)
- \*correct punctuation
- \*paragraphing
- \*accurate spelling (how many of your Yr5/6 words can you use?)

Remember to mumble read. Does it make sense?
