

Writing: Monsters


Today, we'd like you to read through Activity 8 and start on your plan – get the table drawn and decide on your topics. You will complete the plan after your spelling lesson tomorrow.

Topic

Science- The circulatory system

Firstly, read the information on the sheet labelled 'The Human circulatory system' to remind yourself about how the circulatory system works.

Now: you are going to create a double page spread about the circulatory system using all the information you have found out over the past few weeks. There is also a presentation on the home learning page to provide you with further information and to give you an example of what your work should look like. You may also want to include your own research too.

Make some notes for each section before you start to help you. Remember to use your notes from last lesson on the heart too.

You can use the template provided as a guide but your work should be completed on paper.
If you haven't got a piece of A3 paper at home you can always glue two pages of A4 together.

Things to include:

- The 3 parts of the circulatory system.
Eg, The circulatory system consists of three parts, the heart, the blood and the blood vessels. Each part has a very important function.
- Blood- how does it travel? What is it made from? (Use video above and the reading sheet provided for more information)
- Information about the heart and lungs- eg how does the heart work? (including the double pump system) – use you work from last week to help you. What is the role of the lungs?
- Blood vessels- what are the different types and what do they do?
- Diagrams of the above eg blood cells or the heart.

Please send us photos of your double page spread – we can't wait to see what creative ideas you have had!
