Monday 25th

Tuesday 26th

Charlotte's Web

- 1) Mowing the hay.
- 2) A celebration.
- 3) Early summer.
- 4) Gosling.
- 5) Templeton may try and eat a Gosling.
- 6) Your answer needed to include any of the follow:
Templeton is not a nice animal and only looks out for himself. He does not follow the rules of the barn and will do anything that benefits himself, regardless of how it affects the other animals.

Wednesday 27th

Charlotte's Web

- 1) She puts her victim to sleep before eating them. The long word is anaesthetic.
- 2) The sheep told Wilbur to warn him of his fate. It sets up the plot of the story as Charlotte will try and save Wilbur. Was the sheep being kind? You can answer yes or no. Your yes answer may include that he was giving Wilbur a chance to prevent his fate. Your no answer may include that he was enjoying telling Wilbur what would happen to see the effect it has and to terrify the pig.
- 3) Prediction – Your answer needs to make sense in the context of the story so far and reflect what it is possible for the animals to do.
- 4) Fern can hear the animals talk and understood what was going on. She was going to speak to her uncle.

Thursday 28th

Charlotte's Web

- 1) Yes Fern can really hear the animals. The evidence your answer needs to refer to in your answer is: She sits and listens to them. She can repeat

exactly what she hears. She reacts to what the animals say, such as when Wilbur found out he would be killed for his meat.

- 2) Mrs Arable is worried because she thinks Fern is imagining the animals talking and that she is spending too long in the barn on her own.
- 3) Mr Arable is less worried because he thinks she has a lively imagination.
- 4) Your prediction needs to make reference to what has happened so far in the story and be realistic within the plot of the story.

Friday 29th
